



PrimeVR Workshop | Permission Slip

Following the great success we had last spring, we have once again booked PrimeVR to come and deliver a virtual reality experience day at our school on **Wednesday 2nd November 2022** for the children in KS2. We think this is a fantastic opportunity for our pupils and will help to bring their curriculum topics to life.

This year, we are able to offer the children in years 3 and 4 a work shop on volcanoes, while the children in years 5 and 6 will be offered a workshop on China. Both workshops will enable children to be transported to areas of the globe that are normally off limits to school children or indeed, in the case of volcanoes, to the general public. The sessions are planned to be 'virtual' WOW lessons to start of the new curriculum topics that will be starting after the half term and will no doubt make for an excellent reference lesson as the topics continue until Christmas.

The cost of these workshops is being subsidised by the school but we are still asking parents to make a **£3 contribution** towards the cost of the high tech workshop. Can be paid via Parent Pay. Permission slips and payment should be made on or before **Friday 21st October**.

(Please note, it is recommended that pupils with epilepsy or pupils who are prone to seizures consult with their doctor before using a VR headset. If your child has epilepsy or is prone to seizures, please consult with a doctor and inform the school reception before signing this permission slip).

PrimeVR has been delivering workshops using virtual reality since 2017. Our workshops have been specifically designed for schools and are delivered by an experienced member of the PrimeVR team.

During our workshops, we implement the following precautions:

- A full safety briefing is delivered at the start of every workshop.
- Pupils share one VR headset between two and take regular breaks throughout the workshop.
- Pupils will always be required to sit down whilst using a VR headset.
- All headsets are cleaned using Clinell Universal wipes in between classes. These are the official wipes used by the NHS.
- On the rare occasion that a pupil feels motion sickness or dizziness, they will be asked to remove their headset. As an alternative, pupils may (if available) be able to see the experience on a tablet.

Although the recommended age set by the headset manufacturer is 8 years and above, we believe the above precautions, alongside adult supervision, provides a safe environment for all children in KS2 and above.
